Graduates:

I doubt if, in recent years, there has been any word in the English language of greater portent and of more inspiring significance than the word LOYALTY. True, it has sometimes been misapplied and abused, but in its best sense and truest application it has expressed the strongest factor in our national life, for it has welded one hundred million people into one great nation by obliterating parties, demolishing social barriers, harmonizing economic differences and by rallying rich and poor, intelligent and ignorant, strong and weak around our country's banner.

And it is natural that the word which signifies constant, faithful devotion should be prized above all others, for it is rarely used or needed except in times of trouble, stress and strain; and blessed the country, the friend, the cause or the institution which can claim it by right of high merit and noble purpose. This loyalty to country is of course the most wide-spread. It is inherent, born with us and strengthened by attachment to the soil, to the country's language and customs, to the ties of kinship and fellowship. Or it is adopted by those who are attracted to the country's political and social ideals, to its future possibilities and to the congeniality of its institutions. Whether inborn or adopted, it is the most precious attribute of the citizen and, when rightly used, the finest tribute paid to one's country.

The next most frequent application of loyalty is that we give to our friends. Says Hamlet:

"Those friends thou hast, and their devotion tried,
Grapple them to thy soul with hooks of steel".

And these hooks of steel are your loyal thoughts and deeds
when, misguided, unhappy, in trouble, those friends need the
help and understanding of the loyal friend.

Then there is the great but much rarer devotion which we call loyalty to a cause. It takes vision beyond what eyes can see to adopt a cause, and it takes strength of purpose and the spirit of sacrifice to give loyal service to it. And this brings me to the specific application of my text to your present condition - firmly grounded in the theory and practice of music and yet hesitating ere you take the first unassisted steps because of your ignorance of the road you are to travel.

The training you have received from us was not intended merely to enable you to play an instrument or to sing well, nor to earn your living as music teachers, nor to shine as a star performer in a concert hall or opera; but rather that your musical activities, be they amateur or professional, may stimulate others to a greater love and appreciation of good music, thereby enriching their lives and ennobling their souls. That is our cause and, by keeping this aim ever before you and by persevering loyally in its pursuit you will find your road clear and distinct, illuminated as it is by the stars of the great masters who travelled the road before you.

Never has the power of music been more convincingly

demonstrated than in the terrible years of war we have just passed through. It was the song leaders who taught our regiments to sing in unison, who created the esprit de corps, the power of endurance on long, hard "hikes", the spirit of comradeship and the home-feeling which carried our men across the seas, through weary months of routine, through the stress and strain of combat and to final victory. No one appreciates this more than our principal generals in the field, for it created the morale without which their best planned strategy would have failed. It was the military bands which contributed largely to this result and also the host of entertainers behind the front in the rest camps who sang and played so that the soldiers' minds might be turned from the horrors of the battlefield to gentler emotions.

And it is a mistake to believe that the only thing the men cared for was rag-time and cheap popular trash. They were quickly cognizant of the quality of the performance, and would listen more attentively, nay, breathlessly, to a fine artistic performance, than to the strumming of uninspired music.

But you must bear in mind that it is the inspiration of the performer which "puts it over" so that music will reach the hearts of the hearers. The most inspired work of Beethoven will fail to impress if the performance is inadequate and perfunctory. Better a simple, beautiful folksong in which you give the best of yourself than a brilliant but meaningless performance of a great work of art.

And if music played such an important part in war - a

temporary condition it is to be hoped - how much more is it needed in peace times when the humdrum round of the days of toil and care threatens to atrophy all efforts to lift men above the level of material existence.

Let it be your loyal task to carry forward the bright beams of beauty into the dull gray monotony of the lives of plodding multitudes; but remember that, unless your own imagination, your idealism, your powers of self-expression have enabled you to soar high above the materialism of the age, you will not have the power to lift others. Therefore, cease not to work hard on your own development towards a higher, truer artistship, towards a truer individuality based on nobler thought, nobler spirit, nobler aims. And let this creed be the foundation of your loyalty to our cause:

I believe in the trinity of love, truth and beauty and in the power of music to bring its message to every human being.

Is there a nobler mission for you than to devote yourselves, your lives, to the service of this creed?

And, finally, there is the loyalty which you owe and, I do not doubt, are prepared to give unstintingly to your ALMA MATER.

As is the mother who bore us, nursed us, raised us from infancy to man's estate, giving us never failing love and constant service, so is the school which nursed the seed of your talent and trained the growing plant so that it might develop into a beautiful tree full of buds of promise whose flowers and fruit may one day be the delight and nourishment

of all who come to rest beneath its shade. And as we are loyal to our mothers, so we must be faithful and devoted to our Alma Mater. And we must prove our loyalty in three ways:

First, by living up to the standards of art and of character which she has inculcated in us;

Second, by doing all we can to increase her power to carry on her beneficent work in the cause of musical art; and,

Finally, by spreading the gospel of her sacred mission and proselytizing in her behalf among all true lovers of music, so that her disciples may grow in number and her influence encompass the whole world.

I want the Institute of Musical Art to be, not the teacher of the greatest number of students, but the school in which those whom nature has gifted with musical qualities may learn to use them to the best purpose in the interest of true musical art. Already our students include representatives from forty different states, from five foreign countries. Our influence therefore is spreading, and I look forward to the time when our standards, our ideals, will reach into the farthest corners of the globe. But this can only be realized if you, our standard bearers, remain loyal to your Alma Mater, to the Institute of Musical Art.
