Graduates:

To many who graduate from colleges and special schools, the word Commencement means the beginning of the struggle of life, and that struggle is pictured in their imaginations as a race in competition with scores, hundreds, thousands of other men and women pursuing the same objective, in which, by fair means or foul, the strongest will win, the weak, elbowed aside, must fall by the wayside.

This view is, in my opinion, utterly and entirely wrong, for it focuses attention on what is beside us instead of on the path ahead. Instead of devoting ourselves to the task of developing the best that is in us, we are distracted by observing what the neighbor is doing and this often leads to jealousy, envy and malice.

Neither in business nor in any of the professions can such a policy produce good results, but in the followers of art it is most harmful and inexcusable. For the artists or the teacher of art not only degrades himself and stunts his growth by such practices, but he degrades his art by making it the vehicle of his self-aggrandizement.

You, who have devoted yourselves to the art of music, must therefore, look neither to the right nor to the left, but gaze solely upward toward the star of your ideal. You have learned at the Institute of Musical Art

to recognize and to realize what the meaning is of art in music, and it is now your chief and holy duty to approach this ideal by constant effort, by stern self criticism and wholehearted devotion. If you will do this it matters little whether you are the first or the fiftieth or the last, for you will have given your best to the cause and no one can do more. Above all, you will have preserved your self respect, the most precious possession we can acquire and maintain.

Fame and riches can come only to the few, and where they have been acquired as a result of inherent talent combined with honest effort and true devotion to art, they should make us rejoice with the fortunate ones. If acquired by factitious methods, they can only excite our disgust and pity - never envy, for such persons pay a heavy price in loss of character; for, unless a good repute stands back of fame, the famous becomes infamous.

The art of music does not exist by the ministries of the great artists only. It depends fundamentally upon the inherent love of and desire for the beautiful in every normal human being. To awaken this love, to nurse it into action, to show how it may be made to express itself, to lead it into the appreciation of higher and higher manifestations of beauty, that is the mission of all musicians. Whether we be of high or low degree - if we fulfill this mission to the best of our ability - we have done well; and who shall say which is the first,

the great artist who has charmed thousands with his performance of the master works, or the music teacher in a small community who has caused the light of beauty to shine upon the souls of some untutored human beings who, but for his ministrations, would have gone through life groping in the darkness of sordid materialism.
