Graduates:

I confess that when Dr. Damrosch asked me to take his place for a few minutes this evening, I doubted the propriety of an unmusical lawyer like myself presuming to give advice to the graduating class of a conservatory of music; but on reflection I have made up my mind that the problems that confront you are not fundamentally different from the problems that confront young lawyers, or doctors, or even business men upon the threshold of active life. It seemed to me that this observation itself might be worth making and might be of some service in helping you solve your problem. The fact that you have chosen an artistic career shows that you place spiritual values above material values, and for that reason you may feel that your problems are radically different from those of young men and young women who enter what may be termed the gainful occupations and professions. It is even possible some of you may feel that you are or may hope to become geniuses and are under the impression that genius must not be trammelled with the laws that govern the conduct of ordinary human beings. I doubt if this is a sound distinction, and I confess I find myself disposed to give you about the same advice I would give if I were addressing the graduating class of a law school. I should say to you, as I would say to them, that the thing most essential to success is patient, sustained, determined hard work.

Someone, I think it was Carlyle, said that genius simply means a transcendent capacity of taking trouble. Lest I should drive you all into a mad rush to become geniuses, I hasten to add that Carlyle's aphorism is only partially true. Hard work alone will not make a genius. What Carlyle really meant was that, given the other necessary qualities, a man could not achieve the rank of genius without infinite labor. That is absolutely true.

Let me caution you not to confuse feverish activity with that patient, persevering industry essential for success. This is especially so in the arena of art. A soldier may reduce a fortress by sheer dash, a business man may make a fortune by a happy speculation, a lawyer may save his client from the gallows by an audacious manoeuvre, but in the domain of artistic achievement unflagging patience, persistence and thoroughness are the qualities that make for success.

Not long ago, I asked a very distinguished artist, one of the greatest opera singers and one of the most thorough musicians of our time, to explain the dearth of well-trained voices of the first order on the grand opera stage. She answered promptly "because a modern artist gifted with a beautiful voice is rarely willing patiently to work and wait, but yields to the temptation to quick success which so often results in a shattering and a shortening of an otherwise promising career."

In the speech which Dr. Damrosch prepared for me, and which was a so much better speech than the one I

shall make that I would have made it were it not for my inability to commit the words of others to memory, he expressed the hope that in the millenium musicians would not have to work for a living, and prophesied that in that event the world would thrill with their creations. As I presume most of you have to earn your livings, it may be some consolation if I express to you my belief that Dr. Damrosch is wrong. Experience has shown that in every field of human activity, with rare exceptions, the spur of stern necessity was necessary to produce that patient, persistent industry which is essential to success. I remember hearing Mr. Choate say that in his long experience of fifty years he knew of but one lawyer born with a silver spoon in his mouth who had achieved eminence at the bar. Whoever heard of a rich boy or girl becoming a great poet, a great painter or a great musician? No, my young friends, if you have the ambition to achieve brilliant success in your profession, and the happiness which success and achievement brings, you may thank Providence that you were not born rich.

Having counselled industry, or rather, the kind of industry that I conceive to be essential to success, let me add the caution that you do not permit yourselves to be overcome by your industry -- do not let your work stifle your spirit. If you would achieve the success to which your ambition calls, you must keep your spirits fresh and your ambitions high and pure in the face of all forms of discouragement. You must be able to work without tiring. This should be easier for you than for

others because your daily work is the happy refuge to which less favored mortals repair for mental rest and the refreshment of their spirits. You must be able to receive the buffets of fortune with smiling faces, not the smile of resignation, but the smile of confident hope. If you find yourselves staggering under your burdens, if you find your spirits sagging under the pressure of work, you may draw inspiration from the lives of the great composers, how they triumphed in the face of poverty, lack of appreciation, illness and almost every conceivable form of misfortune. Is there in all history a finer example of dauntless courage and buoyancy of spirit than that of the deaf Beethoven composing year after year for the inspiration of succeeding generations, the matchless symphonies which he himself was fated never to hear?

You all feel grateful, I am sure, for the endowment of wisdom, knowledge and power you have received from the Institute of Musical Art. You are grateful to the benefactor whose generosity made this institution possible, to Dr. Damrosch and his devoted faculty who have worked together with such loyal self-sacrifice to give you the best musical education this country affords. The Institute asks but one thing in return, and that is, that you remain loyal to your Alma Mater, that you maintain the high ideals that she has given you, and that wherever you go that you do all in your power to lead others into the Elysian Fields of artistic enjoyment that have been opened up to you by your four years on

Morningside Heights.
