 Eulogy . . . Dr. Frank Damrosch

It is given to few people to pass out of this world and leave behind them the knowledge that they cannot be replaced.

I need not tell you who are gathered here today what Franz Kneisel has done for music in this country since he came to it a mere boy. Gentle, friendly, tolerant as he was in social intercourse, he was uncompromising in his adherence to the high art ideals which he had set for himself, which he lived up to and with which he inculcated his pupils.

His relations to his colleagues as well as to those music lovers who had the privilege of his personal acquaintance were of the friendliest. He found something of good even in those with whom he disagreed. For twenty-one years he has been in this school, an inspiration to his pupils, and to us who have worked by his side — an example of a master who has given in fullest measure of his great gifts as teacher, as artist and as friend. And there is no one to fill his place.

You, his friends, know what he has been to you. And you, his pupils, who are here to say farewell to him, will realize more and more what he has done for you.

A great man has passed out of our lives. The burden and heat of the day are over for him and he is at rest.

To those dear ones whose hearts today are heavy with sorrow almost greater than they can bear, it must

be some little comfort to know that as long as there are people who love the art to which he gave his life, the memory of Franz Kneisel can never die.

Address . . . Dr. Frank Damrosch

Graduates:

I wonder if many of you have considered why you have been doing all this work during the past three or four years or whether you were just "learning lessons" as you did formerly in your Grammar and High School periods, or whether you thought a little way beyond the mere acquisition of knowledge and ability to do. In other words, to what service are you going to devote that which you have learned? I would like to tell you now, in a few very brief words, that you must devote all that you have acquired, all that you are by virtue of the acquisition of knowledge and power, to a definite mission. And this mission is to help civilize the world. Perhaps you think that's an awful job to look forward to. Civilization is not merely not being a savage, not eating your neighbors, or eating with a knife. That is not all it implies. Civilization in its broadest sense is getting away from the purely animal state whereby the human being is satisfied if he has shelter, clothing, food and distraction -- which usually means some ordinary kind of pleasure that can be bought. It matters not whether those who hold this view are rich or poor. There are many uncivilized rich people and there are many uncivilized poor people and in between the two extremes there are millions of uncivilized people. And why are they uncivilized? Because they have not learned

Address by Dr. Damrosch - continued

to put beauty into their lives and without beauty of thought, of the soul and spirit, there can be no civilization. It is barbarous to go through life with no higher ideals than to satisfy the needs of the body and of the senses. Art is the thing that must be put into our lives in order to help us to become civilized. The ability to enjoy beauty whether in nature or created by man is one of the highest pleasures that we can attain. It is the only thing that satisfies us with life as most of us have to live it. It enables us to bear the worries and troubles from which we need release and relief. And the only way in which we can truly turn away our mind from our troubles and our material cares is by cultivating art, which does not mean that we must all play the piano, paint, sculpt or write poetry, but we must be sufficiently educated in art to be able to appreciate, understand and thoroughly enjoy it. And it is your business who have been trained in the finest art of all to bring this art to all the people with whom you come in contact. This is the service you can render to your community, and to humanity in general, and if you always keep that in mind you will fulfill your mission. You have just started to fit yourselves for this work, and you must realize that you still have a high ladder to climb before you can reach the highest steps in the art of music in order to enable you to render the service Address by Dr. Damrosch - continued

which you must give. It is far nobler to give service than to receive applause or wealth. The satisfaction in being able to give something beautiful to people who need it should outweigh any reward that can come to you. Very often I have known artists who have received the most thunderous applause to come away from the platform thoroughly disgusted with themselves because they felt that they had not given their best and the audience failed to realize it. In other words one should not seek reward in the applause of the ignorant, but in the satisfaction of your own highest standards and in this way give the service demanded by your art.

Do not stay in New York where you are not needed -- where there are many great artists to devote themselves to this purpose. Go into the highways and byways. There you will do greater good. Seek a place where your services are needed -- be it large or small. There you can do the greatest good and there you will reap the greatest reward, knowing that you will make that place grow better in appreciation and enjoyment of good music and you will grow with the place. You will get back everything you gave out. The response you receive should prove that what you do for others is appreciated and helps to uplift them and therefore it is necessary that you should keep on in your efforts to improve yourself.

Of course I have often seen girls

Address by Dr. Damrosch - continued

who after they have left the Institute come back, after a few years to see me and say, "I am married now and cannot practice much any more." But let me tell you that it is more important after marriage to keep on with your music than ever before. Why? Because when the children come and if they are to be musicians, and you hope that they will be, they must get their first music lesson within the first month of their existence. And what the child hears while in the cradle, if it is good music, good singing, if it hears sounds which please the ear, it will always retain and acquire the trained ear that you wish you had developed in your early youth. You remember the trouble you had in passing all your Eartraining examinations? It was your mother's fault. So you must keep on studying. You should get complete editions of Beethoven, Mozart, Haydn, Chopin, Schubert and Schumann works. They can be obtained at small cost.

You should know, if you are a planist, every sonata. You ought to, as a violinist, play as a matter of daily duty a sonata by Mozart, Schubert or Beethoven. Play ensemble as often as you can possibly get the opportunity. And if you are a singer, or, at least, have voice enough to sing, learn the folk songs of all nations and as many art songs by Schubert, Mendelssohn, Schumann and other great masters as possible. Listen to all the fine concerts that you may be able to

hear and if you cannot hear those given by others, then give concerts yourself. It will make you practice and study. If you don't make money, it should make no difference to you. In fact the best way to give a concert is not to charge a cent.

Well, to conclude, you have laid a good foundation in solid musicianship. I know that or you would not be entitled to these certificates which you are about to receive. Now build on it as high and as noble a structure as may be within your ability. We are not all gifted alike but we can all build something and the more we try, the greater will become our ability. Then build a structure as high as your resources of mind, body and spirit will permit and you will be able to fulfill the mission entrusted to all true musicians.
