
Juilliard DANCE NEW DANCES: EDITION 2014

About the Artists

Juilliard Dance

Under the artistic direction of Lawrence Rhodes since 2002, Juilliard Dance aims to create true contemporary dancers—trained equally in classical ballet and modern dance. The program was established in 1951 by William Schuman during his tenure as president of The Juilliard School, with the guidance of founding division director Martha Hill. Juilliard was the first major teaching institution to combine equal instruction in both contemporary and ballet techniques.

Each year, 24 new dancers are accepted into the four-year B.F.A. program. In addition to the daily ballet and modern technique classes, every dancer participates in classical and contemporary partnering. dance composition, anatomy, acting, dance history, stagecraft, production, music theory, repertory, and elements of performance. Dancers are encouraged to present their own choreographed works in informal concerts and workshop presentations. In addition, each fall every class has the opportunity to work with established choreographers in dance premieres as part of the New Dances performances. Recent commissions include works by Austin McCormick, Loni Landon, Kate Weare, Brian Brooks, Camille Brown, Darrell Grand Moultrie, Takehiro Ueyama, Aszure Barton, Stiin Celis, Alexander Ekman, Larry Keigwin, Susan Marshall, and Luca Veggetti. Spring performances give dancers the opportunity to perform in established repertory works. Recent repertory performances have included works by Pina Bausch, Merce Cunningham, Nacho Duato, Eliot Feld, William Forsythe, Martha Graham, José Limón, Murray Louis, Mark Morris, Bronislava Nijinska, Paul Taylor, and Twyla Tharp.

Juilliard Dance alumni include choreographers and directors Robert Battle, Pina Bausch, Lar Lubovitch, Ohad Naharin, and Paul Taylor. Juilliard dancers are currently dancing in Netherlands Dance Theater 2, Les Grands Ballets Canadiens de Montréal, BJM Danse, L.A. Dance Project, Mark Morris Dance Group, Cedar Lake Contemporary Ballet, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, San Francisco Ballet, Royal Swedish Ballet, and Batsheva Dance Company, among many others, as well as several Broadway productions. www.juilliard.edu/dance

Lawrence Rhodes

Ballet master and master teacher Lawrence Rhodes was appointed artistic director of the Juilliard Dance Division in July 2002. Mr. Rhodes began his career with the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo, and performed as a principal dancer with the Joffrey Ballet, the Harkness Ballet, and the Pennsylvania Ballet. He was also permanent guest artist at Het Nationale Ballet (Netherlands), while also dancing with Eliot Feld Ballet and with Carla Fracci in Italy. After his first nonperforming role as teacher and chairman of the dance department at New York University, Mr. Rhodes spent a decade as artistic director of Les Grands Ballets Canadiens de Montréal. He received a 2008 Dance Magazine award and a 2009 Dance Teacher Magazine Lifetime Achievement Award for his outstanding work in the industry. Mr. Rhodes is a frequent guest teacher in Europe and has adjudicated for several major international dance competitions.

Austin McCormick

After graduating with a B.F.A. from Juilliard in 2006, Austin McCormick founded COMPANY XIV, offering a blend of circus, dance, opera, live music, and lavish design. At their new performance venue XIV they perform nightly shows in a cabaret setting. Mr. McCormick won the 2011 Robert L.B. Tobin Director-Designer Grant from Opera America for new directors in opera. He has directed and choreographed for Gotham Chamber Opera at the Box and Le Poisson Rouge; and choreographed a new production of *La traviata* for Lyric Opera of Chicago, Houston Grand Opera, and Canadian Opera Company. Mr. McCormick won the 2010 New York Innovative Theatre Award for Best Choreography. His *Nutcracker Rouge* was nominated for a 2014 Drama Desk Award in the category of unique theatrical experience. Future projects include choreography for the Metropolitan Opera. COMPANYXIV.com

Loni Landon

Loni Landon, a New York native, studied at the High School of Performing Arts and at Juilliard. She has danced with Ballet Theater Munich, Aszure Barton & Artists, and the Metropolitan Opera. Ms. Landon is a recipient of the 2013 Princess Grace Choreography Fellowship, nominated by BODYTRAFFIC. Ms. Landon was the winner of the Hubbard Street 2 Choreographic Competition. She has created works for LEVYdance, CityDance, Northwest Dance Project, Ballet Austin, and Ballet X, as well as the Joyce Theater, the Jacob's Pillow Inside/Out series, American Dance Institute, and ODC Theater. Ms. Landon was a participant in the 2012 Alvin Ailey Dance Foundation New Directions Choreography Lab. Ionilandon.com









Kate Weare

Kate Weare is artistic director of Kate Weare Company, known for its combination of formal choreographic values and visceral, emotional interpretation. The company celebrates its 10th-anniversary season at BAM Fisher in February 2015. Weare received a Guggenheim Fellowship in 2014, the Mellon Foundation Residency through the Joyce Theater in 2014 and 2011, and the Princess Grace Fellowship in 2009. She is creating a new work through a creative residency with the Joyce, to premiere in 2016. Weare was the inaugural artist for BAM's Fisher Residency Program in 2013, and held the Evelyn Sharp CalArts Summer Choreographic Residency in 2014. Past awards include a Joyce SoHo artist-in-residency, a Jacob's Pillow artist-in-residency and commission, first prize in N.Y.C.'s The AWARD Show, and a Bates Dance Festival Artist-in-Residency.



Larry Keigwin

Larry Keigwin is a native New Yorker and choreographer who has danced his way from the Metropolitan Opera to downtown clubs to Broadway and back. He founded KEIGWIN + COMPANY in 2003 and as its artistic director has led the company as it has performed at theaters throughout the country. K+C presents Keigwin's dances on myriad stages including the Kennedy Center, the Joyce Theater, and New York City Center. Recent commissions include Royal New Zealand Ballet, National Symphony Orchestra, Martha Graham Dance Company, and the Vail International Dance Festival. His work in musical theater includes the off-Broadway production of *Rent* and the new Broadway musical *If/Then*. larrykeigwin.com




Jerome Begin

Jerome Begin has composed many scores for dance and theater, concert works, installation, and film. Equally at home in the classical, experimental, theatrical, and pop worlds, he has always been drawn to collaboration. Dance score commissions include work for Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Company, Brian Brooks Moving Company, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, Juilliard, KEIGWIN + COMPANY, Gallim Dance, and Sean Curran Company. Recent projects include: *Kwaidan*, a large-scale multimedia opera installation based on traditional Japanese ghost stories; *Thirst*, an evening-length dance work for Jin Ju Song-Begin/Da-On Dance; scoring a documentary about Brooklyn street dancers entitled *Flex Is Kings*; and recording an album with Chris Lancaster in their synth/cello duo band, Tranimal. jeromebegin.com

Curtis Macdonald

Brooklyn-based saxophonist, composer, and producer Curtis Macdonald's works blend composition, sound design and improvisation. He has won commissions from Aszure Barton, Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre, Hubbard Street Dance, and the Museum of Modern Art. Mr. Macdonald enjoys frequent collaborations with a range of artists from new music composers to free jazz improvisers, and from singer-songwriters to electronic musicians. Originally from Canada, Mr. Macdonald moved to New York in 2003 to attend the New School University for Jazz and Contemporary Music. He has released two recordings as a bandleader and teaches sound design at Parsons the New School for Design. Mr. Macdonald is a member of the great American composer Henry Threadgill's Ensemble Double-Up.



Clifton Taylor is proud to have been associated with Juilliard as a designer for the dance and opera divisions since 1995. In that time, he has worked to create new works and revive classic pieces from the repertory. Mr. Taylor designs for opera, dance, and theater companies around the world. His work has been seen on Broadway and with companies ranging from American Ballet Theatre and Alvin Ailey to Indonesia's Sardono Dance Theater. Mr. Taylor is committed to arts education and supporting the work of performing artists at Juilliard and other schools where he has long associations, such as the Royal University of Fine Arts in Cambodia and Casa Richter in Chile.

Fritz Masten

Fritz Masten is a highly versatile artist who has designed costumes and sets for theaters across the country, most prominently the Public Theater, Juilliard, Alvin Ailey, Houston Ballet, and Hubbard Street Dance. As a draper, Mr. Masten has created clothes for Tony Award-winning designers Gregg Barnes, Jane Greenwood, William Ivey Long, Martin Pakledinaz, and Ann Hould Ward, as well as fashion designers Bob Mackie, Thierry Mugler, and Narciso Rodriguez. His contribution to Bill Hayward's photo book *Bad Behavior* was featured in *Vanity Fair*. He created the video *How to Make a Tutu*. Mr. Masten is sought after as a guest speaker, teacher and mentor to students pursuing theater and fashion. He has been nominated for the Joseph Jefferson Award and the Irene Sharaff Award.
