THE ROSEMARY AND MEREDITH WILLSON THEATER April 24<sup>th</sup>- 26<sup>th</sup>, 2015 Welcome to Senior Production 2015, held in the state of the art Meredith and Rosemary Willson Theater.

Having begun in the 1980's, the program Senior Production has seen many incarnations, but its premise has remained constant throughout the years; it is a venue for Juilliard's senior class of dance students to learn and share all aspects of producing a dance concert.

The process begins at the end of the junior year. Dancers, who have shown dedication and rigor as choreographers in their first three years, apply and are then selected to create a work for the following year's Senior Production concert. For this year, seven choreographers were chosen.

The entire senior class collaborates together to accomplish all the production duties in conjunction with the show, from fund raising to publicity, from box office to opening night reception and all the many details in between. Students from the fourth and third year dance classes perform the pieces.

The third year students, as part of their curriculum, take a stagecraft class taught by wellknown lighting designer Susan Hamburger. This course culminates in this production. They are the technical crew responsible for all backstage duties, they have designed, hung and focused the lights for each dance; they are running the light and sound boards during the show, and are stage-managing each work.

A third aspect of Sentor Production involves costume and prop/set design. At the start of the rehearsal process, four professional costume designers are invited to participate in the program by Luke Simcock, the supervisor of Juilliard's Costume Shop. Together with the choreographers, they come up with original designs for each dance. If the choreographers are interested in having stage sets and/or using props, they work in collaboration with set designer Tina Pfefferkorn; Production Coordinator Keith Michael oversees all details. As a whole, the program offers one of the many bridges to the professional world that dancers cross on their way to graduation.

Thank you to the following people for their never-ending support: Lawrence Rhodes, the Artistic Director of the Dance Division for his vision and standards, Keith Michael for being able to answer all questions and for being one of the only people who can keep all of our schedules straight, Brian Grove for mentoring the stage managers plus so much more, the choreography faculty for giving the students the tools and the confidence to take on such a project, the dance faculty for their remarkable dance training, Katie Friis, Robert Clotter and Hilary Tanabe for their organization and their endless help, and Jennifer Edwards in helping guide the seniors into becoming technologically savvy as producers. To all the dancers and the third year technical crew, without you, your talent and your spirit, this concert would simply not be possible.

Since graduating the internship, costume credits include Saturday Night Live, HBO's Boardwalk Empire, Fox's Gotham, USA Network's Royal Pains and America's Got Talent. Sarah also owns a curated vintage clothing label and boutique, LDV Vintage. Originally from Louisiana, she lives in Brooklyn with her beloved.

Amanda Bujak is a professional costume designer and makeup artist residing in New York City. She works in theatre, film, opera and television. Some of her design credits include: *Prophets of Funk* with the David Dorfman Dance Company and *Cantus Articus* with Karole Armitage. She holds a Master of Fine Arts degree from NYU Tisch.

This is **Kimberly Glennon Manning**'s third time with Senior Production. As resident costume designer for the Classical Theatre of Harlem (CTH), she received a 2003 OBIE Award and an American Theatre Wing Design Award nomination for CTH's production of *The Blacks: A Clown Show*, a 2005 AUDELCO Award for Melvin Van Peebles' *Ain't Supposed To Die A Natural Death* and a Howard Hewes Design nomination for *Marat/Sade*. Some additional credits include: *Sixteen Wounded* (Cherry Lane); *Growing Up A Slave* (American Place Theatre); *As You Like It*, and *Tenderland* (The Juilliard School); *'Tis Pity She's A Whore* and *Accidental Death of an Anarchist* (University of Rochester), *The Magic Flute* and *Urinetown* (Ohio Northern University), and the New Orleans production of Samuel Beckett's *Waiting for Godot*, in collaboration with visual artist Paul Chan, CTH, and Creative Time, which was featured at the MOMA; New York Historical Society's *New York Divided* exhibition.

Mary Kokie McNaugher has worked in theater, dance, television, and film as a costume designer and stylist. Most recently, Mary is the new costume designer for *The Ride*, New York's theatrical show and immersive tour. South Florida area. He plans to keep spreading the art of dance and his knowledge to as many people as possible. After graduation, Jordan hopes to dance with a professional company.






